ATTENDANCE COUNTS

We have enjoyed an amazing year so far at Chet F Harritt. We have seen the transition from a closed campus to one that is more open, with school events returning in full force. Chet is alive and thriving.

However, as the year has progressed, we have also seen a marked increase in student absences that aren't illness related. Now is the time to send out the word that, unless you are sick, you should be at school every day on time, ready to learn.

Why are we bringing this up?

Here's a fact and a troubling statisic:

Fact - A student is considered *chronically absent* if they miss more than 10% of the school year, regardless of the reason.

Statistic: Over 20% of students at Chet are considered *chronically absent* today. That's one out of every five children on campus.



Remember, we certainly don't want children who are sick at school. That said, students have 180 days to attend school each school year. Those days are valuable and shouldn't be missed. The school year doesn't have a vacation time built in. That is what breaks and holidays are for. When our doors are open, we are providing purposeful instruction that students need in order to progress academically. Those days are precious.

Things that can help:

- Schedule appointments, family events, and travel during breaks and school holidays.
- If a planned event cannot be avoided, check to see if an Independent Study Contract (usually for 5 or more days, possibly 3 or more days of absence) can be created. Please know we need a week or two notice to get the materials together. Return the contract at the end of the absence with all work completed and absences can be excused. Ask the teacher or the School Attendance Clerk, DeAnna Tritthart, in the front office for information.
- Keep practicing healthy habits (even as simple as hand-washing) to prevent illness.
- Try to make it here every day, even the hard ones. If it is a tough day, reach out and let us know. There's a team here to help.

You should expect see more about increasing our attendance rates and making sure everyone is taking full advantage of every day of learning at Chet. It's a great place to be, so let's do this, together.

TRANSPORTATION PLAN SURVEY

The 2022-23 State Budget included additional funds that school districts can receive to pay for more of the costs associated with providing student transportation services. In order to receive the funds, the District is required to adopt a <u>Student Transportation Plan</u> on or before April 1, 2023 after obtaining input from various educational partners.

The Student Transportation Plan is currently in development and will be taken to the Board of Education for approval at the March 21, 2023 regular meeting.


